Climate

Cardiff's climate is characterised by mild weather. Temperatures in the winter months (December to February) are an average high of 8°C and low of 2°C. During the summer months, (June to August) temperatures can vary with an average high of 22°C and low of 11°C.



Semester only students - Standard Visitor Route

Visa Procedure:

Depends on visa and nationality. Some students must apply in advance. Full guidance will be provided after acceptance.

Eligibility to Work:

Student Route visa - Yes (restrictions apply)

Medical Insurance:

Visitor Visa - No
If coming to the UK for more than six months (Student

Route visa holders): will pay health surcharge to

access UK's National Health Service.

If staying less than six months: insurance is not

required but is strongly recommended.
